

PSD Deficit



2012-13 through 2019-20


- Seven consecutive years of revenues exceeding expenditures
- Since 2012-13, deficit has been reduced by about 99%
- Enrollment initially declined at a fast rate, but has started to flatten out
 - During most of this time, PSD was an "In Formula" district and was funded on a per student basis, which exasperated the financial condition of PSD due to student loss
 - However, starting in 2018-19, PSD became an "Out of Formula" district and is no longer funded per student, but is funded based on the business tax base (good thing)
- The majority of employees and bargaining groups had wages and benefits frozen or reduced for much of this time
 - However, in 2019-20 teacher salaries, and other employee groups, were significantly increased and a formula was put in place to provide automatic step increases and wage increases for future years, based on increases in the tax base
 - This should help to retain our current staff as well as attract new staff
- Based on the current financial trends, there is a good chance that PSD will no longer be a deficit school district once the 2020-21 fiscal year is completed!

- We believe we can continue to add programs and initiatives that will help staff and students, especially once the General Fund deficit is paid off
- We believe we can continue to provide better pay and benefits to our staff that will improve morale, keep quality staff, and attract new quality staff
- The goal is to develop a long-term financial forecast to ensure the district stays the course and becomes a true model for urban renewal

Bond Information Refresher

- \$146 million in building deficiencies identified in 2016, \$69 million being classified as "critical"
- In 2016-17 PSD community passed a 2.87 mill sinking fund that generated about \$7 million per year for 5 years to help address critical issues
- PSD has accomplished many sinking fund projects to date, including projects identified as critical needs

- Unlike some states, Michigan public schools get very little help from the state for capital assets, such as building and site construction and renovations, including athletics, extra-curricular, security, and technology projects
 - That is why the vast majority of school districts continue to go to their voters to approve sinking funds and bond issues
- However, it is the role the school district to keep their financial house in order in terms of day-to-day operations (i.e., General Fund)




How Can a \$147 million bond issue be just 2 mills?

- Historically low interest rates
- Pontiac has been approved use the State's bond rating, which also saves interest costs
- Pontiac Schools tax base provides up to 4 times the resources per student versus other Oakland County school districts (i.e., to generate \$147 million in some districts, the millage rate could exceed 10 mills)

Impact on Taxpayers Current Local District Millage Rates

- Even with the current 2.87 mills, Pontiac Schools has the lowest combined local tax rate for homeowners in Oakland County
- Even with the current 2.87 mills, Pontiac schools has the 2nd lowest combined local tax rate for businesses and other properties in Oakland County
- The approved \$147 million bond issue (2 mills) and 0.80 sinking fund are expected to result in Tax Rate Reduction of .07 mills (2.87 vs. 2.80) for the summer of 2021 tax bill

Series I Bond Sale

Bond 2020 Series I Bond Sale

- The bond issue is planned to be sold in two installments in order to ensure we do not exceed the promised 2.0 mill cost per year to the taxpayers
- The first of two bond sales occurred in July of 2020
- The sale was for \$103.8 million, which means the 2nd bond sale will be for \$43.2 million and is expected to occur in 2025
- The \$103.8 million dollar sale resulted in a net interest cost to the taxpayers of 3.04%, which is historically low
- Even though we have the resources to accomplish \$100 million in projects, and we have great needs, the design, bidding, and construction takes time, and we must also be able to properly manage all projects to ensure a cost effective and quality final product
 - Rule of thumb is that the limit of a manageable summer is no more than \$30 million of project costs

Current Sinking Fund Projects

- Burglar Alarm all Schools All complete except Fell Center
- Card Access All Schools All installing, being programmed now
- HVAC Rooftops WHRC unit 3&4 Complete except balancing
- PHS Doors and Windows Exterior Completed
- WHRC Boiler Re-tube and HVAC Controls In process
- PHS Teen Health Center Project to be awarded 11/16/2020
- PHS/PMS Science Labs In Design Phase
- Various HVAC repairs are also being done currently with Sinking Fund dollars

Current Bond Issue Projects

- PMS and PHS LED Bid Awarded, construction starting soon
- Fell Center Office Restoration Bid awarded, construction starting 4/5/2021
- PMS Doors and Windows -Bid awarded, construction starting soon
- Playground Phase 2 Bids to be presented to Board on 11/16/2020
- Many other projects currently in the design phase





- Recruitment Spring 2021








